Carolyn Argentati Named Associate Vice Provost and Deputy Director of Libraries

Carolyn Argentati has been named associate vice provost and the Donald E. Moreland Deputy Director of Libraries at NC State.

Susan K. Nutter, vice provost and director of Libraries, recently announced the appointment. Nutter stated that Argentati, who had been the Donald E. Moreland Associate Director for Public Services at the NCSU Libraries, would keep her responsibilities in the area of public services while taking on significant new responsibility "for developing and implementing the strategic vision of the research library for the twenty-first century."

Argentati will lead the NCSU Libraries whenever the vice provost and director of Libraries is absent. As deputy director, Argentati will focus on the leadership and coordination of the internal work of the Libraries. She will also stand in for,

and serve as a proxy for, the vice provost and director at campus, library, and development events whenever Nutter cannot be present.

Nutter said, "Carolyn Argentati's leadership skills, demonstrated excellence and effectiveness of performance, length of senior library administrative experience, science library background, record of successful collaboration with and service to faculty and students, exceptional experience with learning technologies and the digital library environment, and stature in the profession will, in combination, serve her, the library, and the university well in this key role."

As Argentati takes on more of the day-to-day management work involved with overseeing the activities of all programmatic areas of the Libraries, Nutter will focus on the implementa-

tion of the Master Plan for library facilities and expand her fundraising and advocacy work with external campus, community, and national and international association and organization constituencies.

The NCSU Libraries offers leading-edge resources and services from its central library, the D. H. Hill Library, and four branch libraries. In all, the Libraries has a collection of more than 3.1 million volumes, nearly 50,000 print and electronic serials, and hundreds of databases, with emphasis on science, engineering, and technology.
