

## Assignment Checklist

Read over the instructions on the page about *Understanding Your Assignment* in the *Paper Writing Toolkit* --and then use this Checklist to make sure you don't miss any crucial instructions!

What important verbs are included in the description of your assignment? Ex: argue, analyze, compare, describe	
What kind of approach do those verbs indicate? E.g., argue would mean using facts, etc. to support your point or opinion about something	
Is there more than one part to your assignment? What are the main parts?	
Briefly describe any special instructions given for this assignment	
Do these instructions describe what types, and how many, library resources you should---or should not---use? Ex. scholarly articles, newspapers, original documents, web sites-yes or no? etc.	
Who is the audience for your assignment? What does your audience already know? What biases might they have?  How will this affect what information you look for and how you write your paper?
