#### NCSU Libraries Rises in Rankings

he NCSU Libraries continued its rise in the ranking of top research libraries in North America. In the latest results issued by the Association of Research Libraries, in 1998/99 North Carolina State University was 35 out of the 111 members. The new ranking represents an unprecedented rise in the ARL rankings since NC State's 101st spot out of 107 members in 1990/91.

The NCSU Libraries' achievements were also recognized recently by its selection as university winner of the first-ever Excellence in Academic Libraries Award. The award and the ARL ranking reflect the innovative services and fine collections, both digital and traditional, that the library has been able to develop. Library director Susan K. Nutter attributed the library's success to remarkable support from the university community—faculty and students, administrators and Board of Trust-ees—who supported the 1996 tuition increase that raised the library budget by 35 percent (\$4.2 million). She also praised the dedication and creativity of the library staff.

#### Town Meeting on Copyright Ownership for Faculty, Staff, and Students

n the summer of 1998, the Office of the Provost created and charged a Copyright Ownership Task Force (COTF) to review existing copyright ownership policies and make recommendations for revisions as appropriate. This task force, which was composed of at least 50 percent faculty representatives, submitted its report and recommendations to Provost Kermit L. Hall in early fall of 1999.

The Office of Academic Affairs and university administration have been working diligently to craft a revised copyright ownership policy in response to the COTF report that achieves a proper balance of the rights and responsibilities of all stakeholders. An important part of this process involves gathering additional input from faculty, staff, students, legal counsel, and university administration. A town meeting has been scheduled for this purpose. This task is taking place at the same time that a task force from the University of North Carolina's General Administration is developing a systemwide policy.

The town meeting will be primarily an informational session to review the current status of these policies and to solicit discussion on the issues and equities involved.
